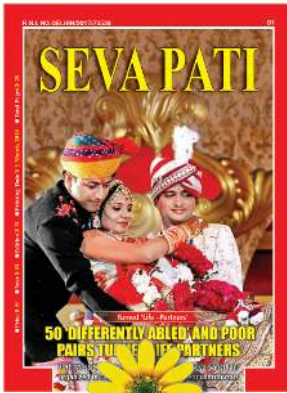

At this, his father got him medically examined at a governmental hospital of his village where the doctor, on examination detected an enlarged gland in his abdomen which was awed to be cancer which could deteriorate his condition if not provided

Mr. Agarwal immediately arranged and provided him with a financial help of Rupees 1,20,000 through the trust. As a result, the corrective surgery of Karan conducted successfully at American Hospital in Udaipur. Karan is now happy and physically fine. His family members admired 'Sewa Parmo Dharm Trust' for its 'free of cost' service activities. Everybody is treated equally at the trust. This is the identity of the trust



proper treatment at a specialized hospital. It was really a cumbersome job for a poor bodily labourer like Jagdish to pursue with the treatment of his son. Jagdish was deeply distressed. The financial condition of Jagdish was very poor as he was the sole earning member of his family. He then got him examined at American hospital in Udaipur where the doctor

advised for an immediate surgery. He wasn't in a position to pursue with his son's treatment. Ultimately, relief provided to Pooja

➔ Everyone in the family of Ram Babu turned happy at the birth of a baby girl in the family of a rickshaw driver by profession from Pitampura, Delhi namely Pooja, but this joy was shortlived. The child was already physically weak 'by birth' and continued to turn 'weaker & weaker' day by day. At this, her parents got her medically examined and got stunned to know from the doctor that Pooja was suffering from a deadly disease 'Thalassemia'. The doctors advised for surgery and assumed her treatment expense as nearly rupees ten lakhs. It was an impossible task for Mr. Ram Babu to arrange this huge sum on his own. He dejectedly returned home with some medicines with a heavy heart and tears in his eyes. These medicines unfortunately didn't work. As a result, the physical condition of Pooja deteriorated 'day by day'.

➔ At that crucial juncture, one of the family members of Ram Babu briefed him about 'Sewa Parmo Dharm Trust', Udaipur. Without wasting a single minute, he came to Udaipur and met the founder of the trust, Mr. Prashant Agarwal. He briefed Mr. Agarwal about his poor financial condition and the deteriorating physical condition of his beloved daughter. Mr. Agarwal immediately arranged rupees ten lakhs for the medical treatment of Pooja on behalf of 'Sewa Parmo Dharm Trust' and provided it as a financial help for the medical treatment of Pooja. According to Mr. Agarwal, Pooja was in the grip of 'Thalassemia' since her birth. She was normal at the initial stage of her life, but gradually her physical condition started deteriorating. Fresh blood had to be transfused every fortnight within her body. The doctors from Ram Manohar Lohia hospital medically examined the girl child and have advised for bone marrow transplantation. ■■

Religious Congregation



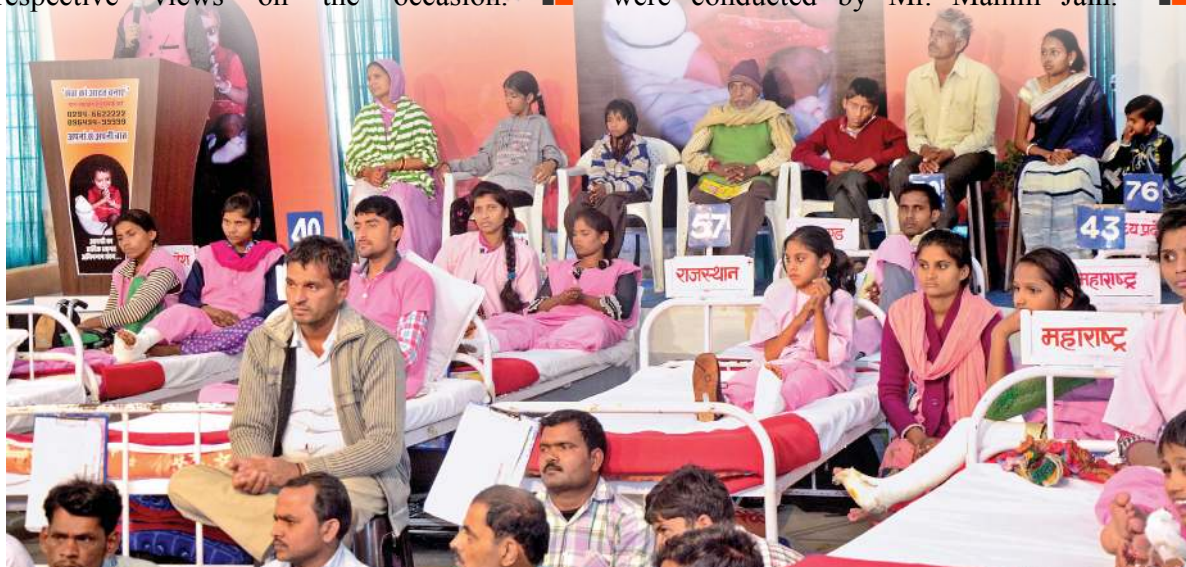

Club Foot Selection Camp // 'Relief' provided to deformed children

Selection camps were organized in various cities of Madhya Pradesh during the month of December, 2017 (under national child health programme) in the joint supervision of 'Narayan Seva Sansthan' and State Government of Madhya Pradesh for the selection of club foot corrective surgery of those patients who, due to their twisted legs find difficulty in walking. The corrective surgery of the selected children would be conducted on a 'free of cost' basis at the hospital of 'Narayan Seva Sansthan' in Udaipur.



Narsingpur ➡ A selection camp for the 'free of cost' corrective surgery of the children suffering from twisted legs was organised at the premises of the district hospital in Narsingpur, M.P. on 16th January, 2018 and on joint behalf of the department of social justice and department of health. The doctor from Narayan Seva Sansthan B.L.Shinde along with team members medically examined 49 child patients at the camp and selected 31 among these as suitable for the 'free of cost' corrective surgery to be conducted on a later date at the hospital of the organization in Udaipur. Dr. L.K.Naibar and Mr. Harsh Kumari Thakur were among those present as special guests on the occasion. ■■

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Helping Camp

➡ The eighth corrective surgery camp was organized from 29th January, 2018 to 3rd February, 2018 and on behalf of Uganda Branch of 'Narayan Seva Sansthan' with a view to provide help and treatment to 'differently abled' brothers & sisters over there. The camp was organized with the joint supervision of the Department of Health and Mulago Hospital. A total of 62 'differently abled' children underwent corrective surgery at Mulagi Hospital, Hoima Orthopedic Centre and Luvero. Specifically designed equipments were also distributed among 31 'differently abled' children. These equipments, to a great extent would put an end to

all the deformities of these children and help them in walking on their own. Body measurements of those 18 children were also taken on the occasion who were compelled to get deprived of their respective limbs due to cancer, polio, brain relating deformities and accidents. It is notable that 'Narayan Seva Sansthan', Uganda got established in the year 2016 with a view to provide relief to 'differently abled' brothers & sisters over there. The polio corrective surgery of 119 child and youth patients have been conducted since then and 110 artificial limbs, 87 wheel chairs, 69 helping equipments and 167 tricycles along with walkers, hearing equipments, crutches have been distributed among the poor and the needy ones. ■■

Due to poverty, they are deprived of proper treatment and proper care. on one hand and on the other, have become a burden for their families, due to their disability. This is the reason, for which, they are disgraced, neglected and scolded every now and then. It becomes a cumbersome job for them, to fulfill even their daily needs and due to their poor financial condition, their life becomes a recurrence of sufferings and sedimentary. With a view to provide economical self dependency to these disabled people, 'Free of Cost' Vocational Training Centers are being conducted by the Organisation, where various 'Free of Cost' programmes relating to Computer training, Electronic equipment repairing, Hardware and Networking, Home appliances repairing, Sewing training, Mobile repairing etc are being conducted.
